Saskatchewanians Abroad

Thomas Hasal - Vancouver Whitecaps FC

Saskatoon's Thomas Hasal and his Vancouver Whitecaps FC 2023 season is underway. The young goalkeeper played 90 minutes in the second leg of the team's Concacaf Champions League Round of 16 match against Honduran side Real España making key saves as the team advanced to the Quarterfinals against reigning MLS Cup Champions Los Angeles Football Club.



Brett Levis - FC Tulsa

Saskatoon's Brett Levis got his FC Tulsa season underway with second-half substitutions in two of the teams' opening three USL Championship matches before showcasing a standout performance against Pittsburgh. The defender went 90 minutes and made key tackles and passes in the team's 0:0 draw.

Following appointments to the 2019 FIFA Women's World Cup in France and 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games, Chantal was again named to the list of officials taking part in the 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup Australia New Zealand.

Former Women's National Team player and Olympic Bronze Medalist, Saskatoon's Kaylyn Kyle, followed her 2022 FIFA World Cup broadcast hosting role with BeIN Sport by landing a key role as studio host in Apple TV's MLS broadcast programming.

From the Saskatchewan EXCEL boys' program, was invited to join the Vancouver Whitecaps full-time U16 program for a week in early February. This invite was earned by impressing VWFC staff in the CANMNT REX Integration Camp in November, the VWFC Fall Tournament between Sask & Alberta programs and in all visits from VWFC staff. Jackson did an incredible job, representing his province, team and self with pride and quality.

Kadence Madraga

From the Saskatchewan EXCEL girls' program, was invited to join the Rest of Canada team in the Super REX Tournament in December of last year.
