



Canada to kick off Women's World Cup campaign July 20 in Australia

Canada Soccer's Women's National Team kick off their FIFA Women's World Cup Australia/New Zealand 2023 campaign against Nigeria on July 21. Canada play matches against Ireland (July 26) and hosts Australia (July 31) to round out their group stage matches. The top two teams in Group B will advance to the Round of 16 and play a Group D opponent on August 7. Canada's Quarter-final match would take place on Aug 12, Semifinal on Aug 16 with the Final scheduled for Aug 20.



Canada complete Nations League campaign kick-off Gold Cup Canada Soccer's Men's National Team finished its Concacaf Nations League campaign on 18 June after advancing to its first ever Nations League Finals in Las Vegas, Nevada. Panama, Mexico, and United States were the other nations to advance to the two-match Final. Canada defeated Panama 2:0 (David 25', Davies 70') on June 15 to advance to the gold medal match against United States who defeated Mexico 3:0 in the other semi. Canada fell 0:2 to United States in the final.

The Men's National Team didn't have long to wait for its next opportunity at continental competition as the team's 2023 Concacaf Gold Cup campaign kicked off in Toronto on June 27. Canada drew Group D opponents Guadeloupe 2:2 in the opener. The team will face Guatemala on Canada Day (July 1) and Cuba on July 4. The top two teams in Group D will advance to the knockout stage and play on July 9. The Semi-finals take place July 12 with the final scheduled for July 16.

Saskatchewan Sports Hall of Fame Inductee – Joan McEachern

Saskatchewan Soccer Life Member Joan McEachern has been selected as a 2023 Inductee into the Saskatchewan Sports Hall of Fame. A native of Leroy SK, McEachern started as a soccer player in Lanigan with her brothers and cousins going on to feature on several provincial teams in both Saskatchewan and Alberta, and participated in collegiate level sport as part of the University of Saskatchewan soccer squad. She was part of a team who took part in the first Canada West tournament.

McEachern is a four-time National Championship winner, including being named the Most Valuable Player at Canada Soccer's National Championships in 1985. She was also a member of a Team Alberta that won gold at the 1987 Western Canada Summer Games, and silver (1987) and bronze (1986) at the Canada All-Star Championships, An active player on Canada Soccer's Women's National Team from 1987 to 1995, McEachern featured in the 1991, 1993 and 1994 Concacaf Championships earning qualification to Canada Soccer's first-ever Women's World Cup in 1995 where she featured.

Following her playing career, Joan fostered the development of future generations as the assistant coach for the Kwantlen Polytechnic University Women's Soccer Team from 2003 – 2015.

Saskatoon Sports Hall of Fame Inductee – Kelly Parker



Saskatoon's Kelly Parker will be inducted into the Saskatoon Sports Hall of Fame at a ceremony to take place November 4, 2023.

Parker represented Saskatoon clubs at three National Championships, featured for Saskatchewan's provincial all-star team at the Canada Soccer Selects showcase, was an integral part of Team Sask at the 1999 Western Canada Summer Games, and at both the 1997 and 2001 Canada Summer Games. She was named Saskatchewan Soccer Association Youth Female Player of the Year Award in 1998.

Parker captained the University of Texas El Paso women's team in 2001 and 2002 after being named team MVP in 2000. In 2015, she became the first soccer player inducted in the UTEP Hall of Fame.

Parker played professionally in Canada, the United States and Germany over nearly a decade from 2003 to 2012. She shared the USL W-League scoring title in 2003 with her Ottawa Fury Women teammate. She went on to be named league MVP in 2004 (Ottawa) and again in 2010 with Buffalo Flash with whom she won back-to-back league titles in 2009 and 2010.

Internationally, Parker was a member of the 2012 Women's National Team that secured an Olympic bronze medal for Canada. In total, Parker made 40 international appearances being named the co-recipient of the 2012 Saskatchewan Soccer Senior Female Player of the Year Award alongside Olympic teammate, Kaylyn Kyle.

Thomas Hasal made an MLS NextPro appearance for WFC2 in June. The Whitecaps FC goalkeeper made two key saves in penalty kicks to secure the victory over Sporting KC II June 2 in Burnaby, BC.

Brett Levis secured a transfer to Detroit City FC in June from FC Tulsa. Levis has played 10 games in USL Championship this season, securing six starts.

Morgan Barry's Saskatchewan EXCEL performances have earned her a week-long trial at the Vancouver Whitecaps SuperREX from June 26-30.




Referees
